Development of Inland Navigation and Environmental Protection in the Danube River Basin

Joint Statement on Guiding Principles

Inland navigation can contribute to making transport more environmentally sustainable, particularly where it substitutes for road transport. It can, however, also have significant influence on river ecosystems, jeopardizing the goals of the EU Water Framework Directive, which aims for the "good ecological status" of all waters by 2015. Recognising this potential conflict in a number of new waterway projects along the Banube and the Sava river, the international Commission for the Protection of the Danube River (ICPDR) has linked up with the Danube Navigation Commission, and the International Sava River Basin Commission to conduct in 2007 an intense, cross-sectoral discussion process. As a result of 3 intendisciplinary workshops, a "Joint Statement on Guiding Principles on the Development of Infand Mavigation and Environmental Protection in the Danube River Basin" was agreed. The final document was adopted in December 2007/January 2008 by the ICPDR, the Danube Commission and by the International Sava River Basin Commission. The "Joint Statement" is a guiding document for the maintenance of existing, waterways and the development of future waterway infrastructure. It is perceived as a milestone that leads to the integration of ecology into waterway




